Youth Shaping the Future: Building Enhanced Perceptions among Youths and Innovating Changes in Tourism

18-27 July 2023 | Korea and Vietnam

1. BACKGROUND

According to ASEAN statistics, youth comprise approximately a third of the combined population of the region and is predicted to reach over 220 million in figures by 2038¹. This cohort of the population is anticipated to be at the heart of achieving the vision of ASEAN community.

As future leaders, youth hold the key in shaping our societies. In this vastly changing environment, the young generation are increasingly expected to be empowered and capacitated not only to swiftly adapt to the changes around them, but also to ensure that they are able to leverage problems and challenges into potential opportunities and innovative solutions. Such challenges include the unprecedented coronavirus pandemic or climate changes issues, and also other local issues that affects their future either at the national, regional or global levels. Although the pandemic has disrupted many aspects of people's lives, meaningful youth engagement in mitigating such crisis and support on the region's recovery would be crucial. Such engagements are also expected to contribute positively to the efforts for building closer sustainable international relations between countries such as that desired between ASEAN and Korea.

Against this backdrop, *the ASEAN-Korea Youth Network Workshop*, one of the AKC initial flagship activity, will be resumed in FY2023 since being on hiatus for the past 3 years due to the pandemic outbreak. The program will bring together youths from both ASEAN and Korea with the aim to raise awareness and enhance their understanding about ASEAN and ASEAN-Korea relations. Held fully offline, the program will facilitate capacity building activities among youths particularly on regional issues that are critical to the effective development of ASEAN and for the establishment of stronger and sustainable relationship between ASEAN member states and Korea. Additionally, the program will provide cultural exposure for the youths to better familiarize and understand the diversity that exist in ASEAN and Korea, as well as provide network building opportunities not only with one another but also with ASEAN-Korea academia and experts.

2. OBJECTIVES

- Raise awareness of ASEAN, Korea, and ASEAN-Korea relations among participants
- Develop youth participant's capacity and understanding of key development issues that are important to ASEAN and Korea
- Provide network-building opportunities among participants
